The Nazi Era: “Ursula and Our Conversations”

Chaitania Hein will talk to us about the process of writing a screenplay that was adapted for the stage. Her piece explores conversations between a curious American daughter-in-law and her German mother-in-law who joined the Hitler Youth at age 15 in 1933. This story traverses the rocky landscape of one woman’s journey from certainty in the illusionary Nazi propaganda machine to discovering the lies of her country and working through deep shame and a paralytic fear over her lifetime. We will see excerpts of the performance in addition to talking through the process of creating it.
