### Creating Sustainable Steps to Healing: How MOi is helping people walk

Founded 30 years ago to help landmine victims, in Vietnam, Mobility Outreach Int'l (MOi) has served over 30,000 men, women and children who live with physical disabilities in some of the world's poorest places. With a focus on sustainability, MOi's global programs and partnerships provide non-surgical treatment for children with clubfoot, as well as artificial limbs, physical rehabilitation, advocacy, and orthopedic surgical outreach in Haïti, Senegal, Sierra Leone, and Vietnam. Their approach ensures that amputees and people with limb deformities are able to walk and can achieve greater independence. Join MOi board president, Dr. Robert Veith, and Executive Director, Heidi Peterson, to learn how this important work is done and the critical difference it is making in the world.
