Registration FAQs

What is the Confronting Hate Together Exhibit?

- The Confronting Hate Together Exhibit is a 22-panel exhibit. It consists of ten original panels created by the New York Historical Society for the original Confronting Hate exhibit in Fall 2022. This exhibit was based on an original AJC campaign done from 1937-1952 on antisemitism (1937-1945) and then all against all hate (1945-1952).
- The Washington State Jewish Historical Society, Black Heritage Society of Washington State, and Wing Luke Museum worked together for 18 months and each added three panels about their communities in addition to an introductory panel.
- Finally, two additional panels were added to provide context for the genesis and the shared experiences of the three historically redlined communities in Seattle's Central District.
- The goal of the exhibit was to demonstrate communities coming together through shared experiences and our partnership to be stronger together.

How will viewing the exhibit on September 19 work?

- Doors open at 5:30pm for exhibit viewing. There will be five 15-minute time slots between 5:30-7pm. Due to space constraints, only so many people will be able to view the exhibit so please come early and be patient as we expect folks may be standing in line.
- When it is your assigned time slot please let staff or our volunteers know and we'll direct you. As you enjoy the exhibit, please be respectful of the time and others who will be waiting to see it.
- No advance reservations for time slots are available and we apologize in advance if you
 are unable to view the exhibit ahead of the program.

- The synagogue must be cleared by 8:30pm. There will be no exhibit viewing after the 7-8pm program.

- Facilitated discussion stations will be set up around TDHS' main sanctuary, we encourage you to float, listen, and share your thoughts and reflections.

 will be a spot to record testimonials at the back of the main sanctuary. Come meet the
 WSJSH's oral history program manager and record your experience with the exhibit or
 antisemitism.

What are the event logistics? Will there be food?

- The event is on Thursday, September 19 at Temple De Hirsch Sinai, 1441 16th Ave, Seattle, WA 98122. There will be a 7-8pm program and doors open at 5:30pm for exhibit viewing

- We will NOT have any food available at this exhibit showcase due to space restrictions
 and the number of people expected. We encourage you to eat prior to entering the
 exhibit or you can leave after viewing the exhibit or getting your assigned viewing slot, but
 please note that you will need to go through security again to re-enter the building.
